According to historian Deidre Beddoe, Orwell "was not only anti-feminist", but "polarized human beings according to sex roles and gender identity and legitimized male displays of dominance and aggression." Author Christopher Hitchens also argued that "every one of the female characters is devoid of any intellectual or reflective capacity", agreeing with Beddoe that "Julia is completely incapable of understanding the motives which drive Winston to revolt." Do you agree with Beddoe and Hitchens? Why / why not? Make sure to support your answer with quotations from the text.

Glossary

- **Thoroughbred** A pure-bred horse, normally used for racing. *e.g. Some riders will only buy thoroughbred horses.*
- Elusive Difficult to find, catch, achieve or remember; a synonym for evasive or slippery.
 e.g. The goal of running a 10k in under 50 minutes seemed even more elusive to him after his injury.
- **Omnipresent** Seemingly everywhere at the same time. e.g. God is often described as being omnipresent.
- **Evade** A synonym for escape or avoid. e.g. He somehow managed to evade capture.
- **Brutalised** Treated in a savage, violent or cruel way. e.g. Julia was brutalised under torture.
- Malign Evil in nature.
 e.g. Big Brother is a malign presence.
